Girls Hostel Project:

This is an on-going project and we are now awaiting details of the building work to be carried out to extend the hostel which AMARA Aid helped to build in Tabora in 2001. A kitchen, dining room and study area will make life a lot easier for Mary and the girls. It is hoped to employ a lady to do the cooking for the girls rather than them having to do it themselves after a long day at school or work. £5,000 has been allocated for this project. ***We will keep you informed.***
